Program Overview

Do you like to work with people and like to work with your hands? The Hospitality Services program, which is designed for students with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), trains students in hotel guest and resident services and in health care careers such as dietary and therapeutic recreational aides. Students have opportunities to practice the skills they learn in nearby hotels, care centers, hospitals, banquet centers, and restaurants. This program is affiliated with the Ohio and American Hotel and Lodging Association.

The Hospitality Services program will teach you life management skills, and as a part of this program, you may be eligible for an Advanced Placement position, allowing you to work in this industry while still in school, earning money and real life work experience.

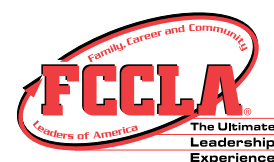

Did You Know?

- Recent MVCTC graduating classes have earned over \$2 million in college scholarships each year.
- Over 60% of MVCTC graduates continue their education at a college, university, or technical school.
- In the 2008 “one year later” follow-up survey, 95% of graduates were enrolled in college, serving in the military, or employed.
- On average, MVCTC serves over 2,900 high school students in the Miami Valley through the main campus, satellite, and Youth Connections programs.
- The average attendance rate for high school students at MVCTC is 95%.
- Every MVCTC student is issued a laptop computer through our Student Notebook Access Program (SN@P).
- Every career program at MVCTC has an Advisory Committee consisting of business and industry leaders in that career area. They meet annually to provide professional guidance and support.
- As part of their career programs, MVCTC students work with several local non-profit service agencies to give back to their communities and improve the quality of life for residents of the Miami Valley (Habitat for Humanity, Ronald McDonald House, Special Olympics, Autism Speaks, etc.).
- MVCTC continues to have students compete at the national level for career technical student organizations (SkillsUSA, BPA, HOSA, FCCLA, FFA, and FEA).
- 2011 marks the 40th year of MVCTC’s commitment to helping high school and adult students learn the skills needed to reach their career goals!

Career Passport

Students who successfully complete a career program with good grades, good attendance, and the ability to demonstrate competencies in their career program will receive a portfolio, which will display a profile of both professional and personal accomplishments. This student portfolio or Career Passport complements the high school diploma that is earned while at MVCTC. They receive their high school diplomas from their partner school district.

Early College Connection

MVCTC prepares students for a seamless transition from high school to college by providing several opportunities to earn college credit and scholarship money towards a post-secondary education. Opportunities are offered to students meeting the established criteria for early college options. Admissions Timeline

December - Sophomore Visitation Days and Open House.

Early February - Applications are reviewed for students who attend one of MVCTC’s 27 partner schools.

Early May - Applications are reviewed from qualified students who live in one of the partner school districts but do not attend one of the 27 partner schools.

Mid-May - If space is available, applications from qualified students who wish to be admitted under MVCTC’s open enrollment policy are reviewed for admission.
