The focus of National FFA Week was to tell America about the great opportunities available for youth in agriculture. - FFA Week was concluded on Friday as the chapter officers conducted a Teambuilding Activity Tour throughout the agricultural labs. The tour

consisted of various interactive team-building activities that demonstrated the importance of teamwork, communication, and leadership.
