Emmanuel Osei Receives West Point Appointment and MVCTC Scholarship

Clayton, Ohio – Miami Valley Career Technology Center (MVCTC) recently announced the 2009 National Technical Honor Society (NTHS) inductees and their honored educators. In order for students to be chosen for NTHS, they must meet the following requirements: a 3.75 grade point average or higher, maintain 97 percent attendance, pass all parts of the Ohio Graduation Test and instructor recommendations. Each of the 2009 inductees is the recipient of a \$1,000 scholarship made possible through the partnership of the MVCTC Education Foundation and the Mathile Family Foundation.

Emmanuel Osei (Trotwood) enrolled in the Allied Health Technologies Tech Prep program at MVCTC, chose to honor as his most significant educators, Ellen Elliott-Bissey of MVCTC and Candice Corwin of Trotwood-Madison. Emmanuel is the son of Stalla Agyeman and Anthony Osei-Agyeman of Trotwood. Emmanuel also recently received an appointment to attend the United States Military Academy in West Point, New York. He will join approximately 1,300 other new cadets in June to begin the sixweek long Cadet Basic Training. Academic classes will begin in August of 2009.

West Point is a four-year undergraduate college offering a core curriculum balanced in the arts and sciences, a required five-course engineering sequence and a selection of 45 majors. After graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree, cadets begin a five-year service commitment in the U.S. Army as commissioned officers. After completing his Bachelor degree at West Point, Emmanuel looks to continue his education at a medical school with the aspiration of becoming a medical doctor. When asked how his education at MVCTC has helped him work towards these goals, he said, "(MVCTC) has given me information on medicine, math in medicine, and medical procedures. The teachers always give me the time needed to answer my questions."
