MVCTC Student Wins National Competition

Clayton, Ohio -- Miami Valley Career Technology Center (MVCTC) students recently returned victorious from the 45th annual National Leadership and Skills Conference, a showcase of career and technical education students. The conference was held in Kansas City, MO, from June 21-26, 2009, and quality career and technical education was the centerpiece of the event. More than 15,000 students, teachers, education leaders, and representatives from more than 1,100 national corporations, trade associations, businesses, and labor unions attended.
