The Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) program at MVCTC is approved by the Ohio Board of Nursing and is either completed as full-time classes, 41-weeks over 11months, or taken as part-time classes, over 22-months. This program prepares students for professional licensure and employment as a Licensed Practical Nurse. Following successful completion of the MVCTC LPN courses, students are eligible to sit for the National Certification and Licensing Exam (NCLEX-PN).

MVCTC Adult Education in partnership with the Brethren Retirement Center (BRC) is able to offer LPN classes in the Darke County area at the BRC in Greenville.
