The MVCTC Adult Education Machine Tool Craftsman program teaches skills in blueprint reading and math; machine theory; and how to operate milling machines, lathes, grinders, CNC, and other machine equipment. MVCTC also offers a high school program, Precision Machining Tech Prep, for juniors and seniors to learn the skills necessary for a successful career in manufacturing. The program teaches students 3D modeling with SolidWorks, CAD/CAM with Delcam's FeatureCAM, conversational CNC, G-Code

programming as well as the basics on all of the manual machines. The high school program offers students the opportunity to work in the industry while still in high school, through apprenticeships and co-ops, getting real-life work experience as well as a paycheck. Students have the potential to earn college scholarship money and college level credit to Sinclair Community College where they can continue their education after high school.
