MVCTC Education Foundation and Mathile Foundation Award Honor Society Students \$68,000 in Scholarships

Clayton, Ohio – Miami Valley Career Technology Center (MVCTC) inducted 68 students into National Technical Honor Society (NTHS) on Sunday, March 27, 2011. This is the largest number of students ever meeting the requirements to become a NTHS member. The NTHS students as well as their honored educators from MVCTC and their partner school district, were recognized in a ceremony at MVCTC in front of family and friends.

Students are selected for NTHS based on the following requirements: a 3.75 grade point average or higher, 97 percent attendance, passed all parts of the Ohio Graduation Test and instructor recommendations.
