Pamela Wallace-Stroble Receives Award from MVCTC

Clayton, Ohio – The Miami Valley Career Technology Center (MVCTC) named Pamela Wallace-Stroble, Coordinator for Ohio Core and PK-12, from Wright State University, as the recipient of the 2011 Friend of MVCTC Award. Ms. Wallace-Stroble received the award at the 21st annual All Advisory Dinner held on Thursday, September 29, in the MVCTC Student Activity Center. MVCTC Superintendent, Dr. John Boggess, describes this yearly award as, “This award is given each year to someone who is always supportive of our mission, our programs, and our students. Those nominated are the professionals who willingly give a tremendous amount of time and talent to insure MVCTC has continued success”.

The MVCTC Academics Department nominated Ms. Wallace-Stroble, for her continued support of MVCTC students and staff. She has worked in partnership with MVCTC to create some of the first dual enrollment programs in the Miami Valley. Because of her dedicated work, MVCTC students have earned 592-quarter hours at Wright State University since the 2008-2009 school year. This year MVCTC seniors are attempting 240-quarter hours. All these credits are general education credits, transferrable to any college or university in Ohio’s state system.

The MVCTC instructors said of Ms. Wallace-Stroble’s support, “her willingness to tackle the issues associated with initiating, and sustaining a dual enrollment program has been extraordinary. With enthusiasm and efficiency, she serves as a bridge between our schools, helping the faculties at both Wright State

University and MVCTC create a model program. She has contributed to the success of students at MVCTC. She is a Friend of MVCTC.”

The evening also included the induction of ten Montgomery County Joint Vocational School (MCJVS)/MVCTC alumni to the MVCTC Hall of Fame. The Miami Valley Career Technology Center Hall of Fame was established in 1991 to honor graduates for the significant contributions they have made to their profession and to their communities. Family, employers, employees, teachers, and friends nominate MCJVS/MVCTC graduates every five years. This year’s Hall of Fame Inductees included:
