The Woodland City-Wide Contest exposes MVCTC photography students to a peer competition, much as they would experience as photography professional. It also allows students to enhance their portfolio.

A student in the MVCTC Graphic Commercial Photography Program will learn highly skilled training for an in demand career field. After completing the two-year program, students would be able to pursue a career as a Portrait Photographer, or Freelance Photojournalist, and with additional training could become a Medical/Forensic Photographer, Commercial Photographer, Studio Owner/Manager, or a Digital Imagery Technician. The Graphic Commercial Photography program at MVCTC is a Tech Prep program, which means all students meeting specific criteria may be eligible for college credit and scholarship money towards Sinclair Community College.
