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## **MVCTC Students Win in National Competition**

This event involved two rounds of competition. Round One consisted of a written test to evaluate the team's understanding of forensic medicine. After Round One, Drew and Quinton scored high enough to advance to Round Two. For Round Town, they were given a case study related to forensic medicine. Drew and Quinton had six minutes to analyze a case study, which included written information and physical evidence. Finally, the team was given thirty minutes to write their conclusions.

HOSA's two-fold mission is to promote career opportunities in the health care industry and to enhance the delivery of quality health care to all people.
