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MVCTC Hosts 10th Southwest FFA Skills Classic

FFA members from ten local chapters competed in 15 different contests, testing the skills they have learned in their Career Technical Agriculture Education program. Schools competing included A.B. Graham Ohio Hi-Point, Benjamin Logan, Eaton/MVCTC, Felicity Franklin, Greenville, Miami East/MVCTC, MVCTC, Parkway, Tolles Career & Technical Center, and Waynesfield Goshen.

The Southwest Skills Classic allows each school to enter a maximum of two qualified students in each contest. Each student may compete in two events. The contests included: Aquarium Management, Assembly Procedures, Flower and Vegetable Identification, Corsage Making, Hand Lawn Mowing, Job Application and Interview, Painting and Ladder Safety, Personal Finance, Commercial/Walk behind Mower Operation, Small Engine Parts Identification, Tractor Operation, Tree Transplanting, Animal Care Identification, Meats Identification, and Natural Resources Identification. The top two individuals in each of the 15 contests areas received a plaque. Team scores were calculated based on the highest seven individuals placing in any of the 15 events. The top five teams received a team banner.
