The purpose of the meeting was to explore the viability of MVCTC offering a high school Firefighter/EMT career technical program.

Representatives from regional fire departments were in attendance to hear about the proposed program. Departments in attendance included Trotwood, Englewood, Union, Riverside, Clayton, Brookville, Vandalia, Harrison Township, Verona, Eaton, Dayton City, and Huber Heights.
