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MVCTC Receives "A" Rating on New Ohio Career Technical Report Card

Clayton, Ohio – The Ohio Department of Education (ODE) released the new Career-Technical Planning District (CTPD) Report Card the week of August 19, 2013. According to ODE, "The new rating system is believed to be the first of its kind in the nation to use A to F letter grades and to exceed the requirements of the federal Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Technical Education Act."

The data from the new report card is for students from the graduating class of 2011 in each of Ohio's 91 CTPD's. MVCTC was one of only 11 CTPD's in Ohio to receive an A rating in all areas. MVCTC reported the following measures:

- 96.7% CTPD students graduated in four years
- 96.6% CTPD students graduated in five years
- 91.7% of CTPD students were employed, in an apprenticeship, joined the military, or were enrolled in postsecondary education/advanced training in the six months after leaving high school

Also included in the "Report Card" are non-graded measurers on Achievement -Technical Skill Attainment, Prepared for Success – earning college credit while in high school, Post Program Outcomes – earning industry credentials, federal accountability results from the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act, and financial data for each CTPD. MVCTC reported 79.2% of students passing technical skill assessments, and 79.4% of students earning college credit while in high school.

MVCTC Superintendent, Dr. Nick Weldy, shared, "I am very pleased with the results of our State Report Card. I believe it is a direct reflection of the hard work from the students, staff, and administration. It is another way we can demonstrate to our stakeholders the level of success we achieve at the Miami Valley Career Technology Center every day."
