### CELEBRATING SUCCESS AND LOOKING FORWARD

Spring is an exciting time at MVCTC, especially as we count down the remaining days of the 2022-2023 school year. This was a monumental year at MVCTC, as we moved over 80% of our on-campus staff into their new career-technical labs, academic classrooms, and office areas! This would not have been possible without the efforts of everyone involved in the move, including all of the staff, and especially the students and the parents for their patience and flexibility. Thank you!

For the fifth year in a row, we sent students to Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas, as finalists in the NASA High school students United with NASA to Create Hardware (HUNCH) Project! The HUNCH mission is to empower and inspire students through a Project Based Learning program where high school students learn 21st-century skills and have the opportunity to launch their careers through participation in the design and fabrication of real-world products for NASA. Mrs. Melissa Goodall and her Computer Coding & Web Applications students presented their research in April, and we are very proud of their efforts as they competed with other students from across the nation!

The last few months have provided MVCTC with many opportunities to celebrate our students' success, including Career Technical Student Organization Competitions at the regional, state, and national levels. Students have qualified for national competitions from Dallas, Texas, to Anaheim, California! This is all possible thanks to our dedicated staff preparing these students with the skills necessary for their chosen career paths. We are delighted to share these student achievements throughout this newsletter and encourage you to visit our website (www.mvctc.com) on a regular basis to see even more good news.

We end the year with a celebration of our senior Class of 2023! We are honored to be a part of this group of young adults' journey to the workforce, college,

and beyond. Preparing them for career and college is what we do at MVCTC, and this group of students has been impressive! The Class of 2023 ended the year with \$5.3 million in total college scholarships earned, 792 students earning \$2.3 million in Tech Prep Scholarships, and the Internship/Pre-Apprenticeship students worked over 126,000 hours this school year and earned over \$1.75 million in wages.

As we end the school year, it is in our nature to look at the next one on the horizon. For the 2023-2024 school year, we are inspired by the completion of our multi-year construction project and the growth it will allow for students at MVCTC. This includes the addition of three new career-technical programs, Drones & GIS Technologies, Pre-Engineering, and Pre-Law & Legal Studies, as well as new satellite program partnerships with Huber Heights, Miamisburg, and Northridge. In addition, we will be expanding our Veterinary Science program on the main campus so that we can provide the educational experience to even more interested students.

In closing, the students who are finishing their educational careers at MVCTC this year are a special group, and, if you can't already tell, we are very proud of them! They are full of knowledge, work ethic, and pride in what they can now do with the skills they have gained. But, it is their energy and determination that impresses me the most. They are ready to make a positive impact in the world, and, in each of them, I see hope for the next generation of Americans who will help our country excel. #### Five Years, Five Finalists at NASA Hunch Program

For the fifth year, Mrs. Melissa Goodall and her Computer Coding & Web Applications students presented their research at the Johnson Space Center in Houston, TX.

The group of Seth Lyall (Bethel), Eris (Malayna) Suther (Miamisburg), and team leader Samuel Brown (Milton-Union) were announced as finalists. Their prototype project was the Solar Tracker software system for the Mars Rover project. They used engineering techniques, modeling, 3D printing, electronics, a Raspberry Pi, solar panels, an Arduino, and programming to find the brightest light source in a nearly 360-degree rotation to power the Mars Rover. Mrs. Goodall said, "They did an outstanding job documenting their iterative engineering process to arrive at a workable solution!"

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
