

2022-2023 Senior Mandatory Work Experience Program

The Senior Mandatory Work Experience Program is **mandatory** for all seniors. The students will have three options for completing the program:

Option A: Students will complete and document 30 hours of community service between the completion of the junior year and prior to the third Thursday in April of the senior year. All community service hours must be completed outside of the regular school day. Suggested activities for community service are outlined on the attached document. If you have an activity in mind that is not on the list, please check with your career technical instructor or career technical program supervisor to ensure the activity meets program requirements before engaging in the activity. Students choosing this option will complete the Community Service Log-Form A.

Option B: Students will work 30 hours in a paid position from May 10-16 (related or non-related to your career technical program). Students choosing this option will complete the Work Experience Agreement-Form B.

Option C: Students will complete a combination of community service (Option A), and work experience (Option B), for a total of 30 hours. The community service activities are to be completed between the completion of the junior year and prior to the third Thursday in April of the senior year. The work experience hours must be in a paid position from May 10-16 (related or non-related to the student's career technical program). Students choosing this option will complete both Community Service Log-Form A, and Work Experience Agreement-Form B.

The Senior Mandatory Work Experience Forms can be found on the MVCTC website behind the *Current Students* >>>> *Senior Information* tabs.

The completed documentation is due to the career technical instructor by the third Thursday in April of the senior year.

Once the Senior Mandatory Work Experience Form(s) is/are submitted, the career technical instructor and career technical supervisor will review the information, and if found to be accurate and verifiable, will approve the hours.

Students will not be on campus May 10-16, 2023. The 30 hours of community service and/or work experience will satisfy the attendance requirements for the week.

The Senior Work Experience Program is a requirement to participate in the MVCTC Senior Recognition Ceremony, accounts for 10% of the 4th quarter grade, and satisfies the Senior Work Experience Program attendance requirements.

Students not completing the Senior Work Experience Program will not receive a Certificate of Recognition.

All student fees must be paid before May 9, 2023.

MVCTC's Senior Recognition Ceremony is scheduled for May 18, 2023, at the Wright State University's Nutter Center. More details about Senior Recognition Ceremony will be provided at the conclusion of the third grading period.
